

This volume of the Newcastle Series represents something of a departure. All previous volumes have set out to record, as accuarately as possible, the steps of an dancer, or on occasions, dancers, the steps being collected directly from the individuals concerned. However, this booklet, for reasons which will become apparent, deals with the steps of a dancer who I never saw actually perform, Tiny Allsion. The steps were notated from the dancing of several of her pupils, however it seemed more appropriate, on this occasion, to collate their various memories into one composite booklet, to allow the widest picture of Tiny's dancing to be built up.

Mabel "Tiny" Allision (whose married name was Stacey) was born in Stanley, County Durham in about 1920. She had become interested in dancing following a visit to the pantomime at the Empire Theatre, Newcastle aged 12 and subsequently had learned to tap dance from a "Madame Rogers" in Newcastle. She had learned her original clog steps from a well-known local dancer living in Stanley, Harry Robinson and had run dancing classes in Stanley for many years, teaching stage dancing and tap. She entered the revivied Northumberland and Durham Clog Championship in Gateshead in 1936, and although not victorious, she so impressed one of the judges, Dickie Farrell, that he taught her his own championship steps.

She had never lost her interest in clog dancing and, when the EFDSS sought to revive the Northumberland and Durham Championship Competitions in 1949 at Hexham, Northumberland, she entered and was awarded first place.

Subsequently she taught a number of her pupils to clog dance and at the 1951 Championships, once again held in Hexham, her pupils scooped the pool, Jackie Toaduff coming first, Dorothy Lister (nee Kennedy) second and Dorothy's brother Brian Kennedy third.

J only met Tiny once, on the 15th September 1980, at her home in William Street, Stanley, in company with two other resarchers, Cath Hays and Nick Springham. Unfortunately she had recently suffered a stroke and, although keen to help was unable to dance, although she demonstrated several steps with her hands. I well remember her frustration when we could not understand what she was trying to show us. The step in question turned out (on further investigation) to be Step 9 in the notations given below.

Unfortunately Tiny died in September 1981 and resort had to be made to her pupils to recover the detail of her clog repertoire.

Accordingly, the notations given below were collected from the following informants:

Mrs Doreen Kerr. First visited in company with fellow researchers Julie Jarman and Alice Smith on 1st March 1982. She had joined Tiny's class in 1946, aged about 7 and had continued, almost without a break until she was 27, latterly helping Tiny in the running of the class. She danced in the Junior Championship at Hexham in 1949. Stylistically Doreen's style was rather wide – her A:A position being with the feet

about 8 inches apart – and her shuffles rounded and normally well away from the supporting foot in C/D position. She approved of a rather bouncy style of dance with plenty of lift and drive off the supporting foot. There was no particular order for the steps, save that one would finish on "Double Shuffles" (ie Step 17or 18). She remembered the tunes The Bluebell Polka and The Trumpet Hornpipe but recalled that the main tune to which they practised and danced was Harvest Home.

On the 1st March 1982 we collected Steps 1-5, a version of Steps 17 or 18 and Finishes A and B. She described Finish A as "the simple shuffle-off". Finishes A and B could be used interchangably for her steps.

On the 8^{th} March 1982, she corrected the finish for her Double Shuffle to that shown in the notations as Step 18, and taught Steps 6-10, together with the finish to Step 10. However at that stage the foot positions were noted in outline only. She knew two other steps which she was unable to remember.

On the 29th August, she corrected her version of Double Shuffles, confirming that Step 16 was the one she danced. We (on this occasion Julie Jarman and myself) also noted the foot positions for Steps 6-8 (she was unsure about Steps 9 and 10) and collected Step 11 which she had now recalled.

Dorothy Lister (nee Kennedy). We (Julie Jarman and myself) met her at Doreen Kerr's home on 13th September 1983. She was older than Doreen and had perhaps a greater memory of the earlier years of Tiny's clog teaching. She was able to recall that there were two discreet sets of clog steps taught. Six "junior" steps, which she had in fact never danced, and a "senior" set of 10 steps. The latter had been the ones originally taught by Tiny for the Championships in Hexham in 1949 and the "junior" set had come later. She taught and/or confirmed the following steps, her 10 Step routine being, apparently in this order:

Step 7, Step 12, Step 1, Step 6 (with alternative Finish), Step 13, Step 14, unknown step, Step 15, Step 16, Step 8 (with variant B section). Additionally she said that they always finished their routines with Step 17, which she called Double Shuffles.

She also taught Finish C, without knowing to which step it should be attached.

Dorothy also recalled her pedestal routine, this beind Step 7, Step 12, Step 1, Step 6 (with alternative Finish), Step 15, Step 8 (with variant B section). The Double Shuffle used for the pedestal routine was also Step 17.

She did not use Finish A. Her style was generally neater and more restarined than our other informants, her shuffles being in C, rather than C/D. She was also in the habit of interpolating a shuffle on the upbeat, before the first strong beat of her steps, where this was possible.

Brian Kennedy. We first met him at Doreen Kerr's house on the 15th March 1982. Brother of Dorothy Lister. He had begun dancing with Tiny aged 6 in 1941 and had

danced with her until he was about 20. He had competed at the Hexham Championships in 1951 coming third, having competed in the Junior Competition prior to that date. He had done a little performing around clubs in the area as part of a concert party. His style was very energetic, with an enormous amount of drive, his shuffles being straight in position C/D.

Jackie Toaduff. First visited by myself and Barry Callaghan on 22^{ad} July 1985, when background material only was noted. Jackie's background as a clog dancer with a career spanning over 50 years has been fully documented elsewhere – see Fisher, Alexandra M., *Clog Dance, Revival, Performance and Authenticity. An Ethnographic Study*, MA Thesis, University of Surrey (2000), and his steps are published elsewhere – see Fisher, Alex, *Jackie Toaduff. Competition Hornpipe Steps*, Newcastle: Newcastle Series (2009). All that is reqired here is a brief synopsis. Also from Stanley, he originally learned to tap dance from a local dancer "Jocka" Richardson, and after his death joined Tiny's troupe. Taught to clog dance by Tiny for a few short weeks before the 1949 Hexham Championship, he won the Junior Competition that year and the Senior Competition in 1951. Thereafter he became a professional dancer with an international reputation, incorporating clog dancing into his act.

Jackie dances with a considerable amount of verve, and in his heyday clearly danced very fast indeed. A very neat dancer however, his shuffle position being C,C.


I met him, with Alex Fisher, again on 26th February 2001, and 7th May 2001 and 10th December 2008, when his repertoire was collected. In addition to several steps not known to those interviewed in 1982 and 1983, he was able to perform several steps which were identical to theirs, or nearly so. These are referred to in the notes to individual steps. Because of Jackie's long dancing career, it has been felt more appropriate to publish his steps as a cohesive set, as referred to above, as it seems more than likely that slight enhancements have been made by him over time.

The steps are all notated off the left foot. Tiny and her pupils normally repeated steps in performance, although Jackie Toaduff did not always do this in his cabaret work.

No attempt has been made to distinguish between the slight differences in foot position exhibited by the dancers referred to above, save for the occasional note. In particular I have chosen to notate the shuffle movement in $:\vec{c}, \vec{c}$ – although there are one or two exceptions where a different position appeared to be more appropriate. As explained above that does not reflect the precise position used by two of the informants.

I am indebted to Alex Fisher for the information on Jackie Toaduff, and all those, mentioned above, who were involved in the collection of this material. The proof of this booklet has been read and commented on by Ed Wilson. Any remaining errors are of course entirely my own.
