not show me any now. He later relented and  
said that if I lent him a pair of clogs he  
would see what he could do.

He had been entered for a competition once  
but ~~had~~ decided not to enter at the last moment.  
He had danced at go-as-you-please.

No other members of his family had danced.  
He knew of no other of Dickies pupils + had  
not met any other clog dancers.

He said DF always danced very straight - hands  
by side.

Julie Jamman + Cath Hays visited Jackie Carr of  
50 North Eaton Rd.  
Newbiggin.

He was a bandleader and had never clog-danced.  
He met DF at a time when he was trying to  
remember the tune he used to dance to teach a  
young, very promising dancer - perhaps after DF had  
not danced for some time. This was after WW2 -  
1946-9. DF whistled f. Carr his tune + he wrote it  
down. He could not however remember the tune at

all although he thought it was a hemppie.
