Mr and Mrs Tom Percy, Caw House, Over Wyresdale, ages 64 and 59. We travelled down to Wyresdale to see Mrs Percy's family Miss, and whilst there we leavet some of the family kistory.

Mis Bency's father Edward Winder was one of five botters, the others being James, John, Richard, and Tom. All are now dead. James and John were the two who danced the Greensleeves dance for Cecil Sharp.

Edward Dude's fatter was James Winder of Greenbank (Knowsley Fam), Over-Wyresdele The MSS were written on 1830 by a Edward Unider of Greenbank, who wan pressmably the fatter of James Winder (is was Mrs Percy's great-grandfatter). The MSS mention also a John Winder, dencing-mester", presumably Edward Winder's brotter. It is a family tradition that Schward (?) and John were brought up at Wyre Home Fam. Mrs Percy's fatter told her of John, the dancing-master. He hied at Grasstang in a little cottage [opposite the Riddle bus station]. They do not know whether he was a full-time teacher, ar whether he travelied normal the circa. He dived befare Mrs Percy was born. Although he was marned, he had no family.

Mu Percy has never heard the Greensleeves dance called a Morn's dance. In her family it was just called Greensleeves.

Mus Percy has heard her fatter talk of the Swinging-6, but has never heard of The Square-8.

Mrs Percy and her husband have never seen a broom dance as the kibby step.

The Percy has a photograph of a band which played for dances around Dolphenholme; her fatter of two uncles played in it. The mitruments were: A fiddless, base cells, a large hasp, two comets (?) and a piccolo.
