There was no dance done with a handkerchief, & none of the Dales "dances" other than those listed above.

A Mr Bibby from Arkholme came & gave dancing lessons in Tunstall. Mrs Batty went just to watch. The classes took place about once a week, and the repertoire consisted of ballroom dancing only — there was no step-dancing. Mr Bibby only taught in his spare-time — in the evenings — he was not a full-time teacher.

When Mrs Batty was about 12 she saw a Mr Lawson — an old man then — give exhibitions of clog-dancing. He also danced a "Three-Reel" with one(?) old lady, as an exhibition at dances.

Mrs Batty has never seen or heard of Greensteves or the broomstick dance.
