At the White Lion at Bowness

... the rasp of a dancing school fiddle & the clatter of the sturdy footed youth drew us amongst them up a flight of stone stairs into a large room where we were not a little amused by the essay of the lads & girls of Bowness - a more awkward squad can scarcely be imagined & the rough & bawling voice of the master promised but an ill omen for the graces & manners of his pupils - however let me not undervalue - I believe there is no such thing amongst our Irish peasant children - praiseworthy & innocent endeavour in the Parent to educate & improve the mind & assist the symmetry and graces of his little ones - & worthy of commendation -

8th April 1804

Mrs. Murphy, Miss Crawford, Mr. Handiman & I went in the Evng. to Ritchie's Ball to see Mrs. Allen's Children dance. I don't think he is a very good dancing master, nor is his school very fully attended. I went with my Aunt Learmonth to Stuart's on Friday which was much

better going to. He is Strang's successor. Jessy
 is one of the principal performers & little Maggie
 too makes a very good figure as she dances extremely
 well & being so small makes it still appear better.
 Elzette thinks herself too old to attend this winter but
 I think it rather a pity she has commenced old women
 so soon, she is so very little one would hardly
 guess her to be above 12 yrs. old, ...
