Clogs or Shoes - Footwear for the Fife Dances

There seems to be some doubt as to the status of two dances collected from Mr William Adamson of East Fife by the late Tom Flett. i.e. the Clog Hornpipe and the Liverpool Hornpipe. This doubt arises as to whether one, both or neither of these dances was performed in clogs.

I trust that the following extracts from Prof. Flett's notes will help to clarify what has become a rather murky pool.

I have also included the few notes on the Lancashire Hornpipe and the Flowers of Edinburgh which occue in the MSS although no notations were recorded for these dances.

A. Field Notes. Fife and Perth, 1956. n.p.

L'pool H is a clog dance? No just heavy shoes but can be done in clogs.

Lancashire H a heavy shoe dance. Knows only a step or two.

F of E (both sexes) taught in Kinglassie, 1911, but nowhere else. Lovely step dance for adults only.

B. Written Up Notes. 8/9/56

p15.

He also taught a number of step dances......Flowers of Edinburgh. The last was a trebling dance for adults only and he can now remember only one step. He himself taught it only once, at Kinglassie ca.1911. It was danced by both men and girls.

p16.

- For the clog dances, he had Highland pumps to which a heel two or three thicknesses of plywood had been added. Nothing extra on toes. For exhibitions at concerts, he wore white shirt, tie, velvet breeches, knee-length, and green stockings. The green stockings were because he used the same costume for the Irish Jig. He wore proper clogs then, and had bells fastened under the instep, close to the heel of them.
- * the word "plywood" has been crossed through and the word "leather" inserted above.

p25.

8) Concert Dress, Shoes etc.

At concerts...... For the Jig (Irish) and Clog Hornpipe, he wore thick green stockings, velvet breeches, almost navy blue, with pearl buttons up the side, a white shirt, no collar or tie. A red neckerchief for the jig but not for the clog. For the jig he wore Highland dancing pumps with wooden heels added...... For the clog, he wore clogs, but in classes he wore his pumps with heels.....

9) The Liverpool Hornpipe is a heavy shoe dance, not clog. So also is the Lancashire Hornpipe Both can however be done in clogs.

PRESTON WEEKEND

25-26 Feb 1984

The only thing wrong with this weekend was that not enough of you came! You don't know what you are missing, or rather missed.

I could detect no organisational flaws and indeed the whole event went off with great smoothness. All credit to Melanis Barber and Alan Whittaker who organised the whole thing for the Lancashire Wallopers.

The workshops were taken by a mixture of old and new faces, but, with the exception of the beginners class, were all taken or supervised by the original dancers themselves. The only real difficulty was in deciding which class to attend.

I went for the Bill Gibbons class. I wondered how Madelaine Hollis, who was actually teaching the steps, under the eagle eye of Mr Gibbons, would tackle a "freestyle" clog dance of such an unstructured nature. Madelaine handled the material excellently and managed to formulate the small units of which the dance is composed into an easily understandable format. I understand that an accompanying booklet is in the pipeline and this should add much to the understanding of this type of dance. The difficulty lies in stringing together the one, two or even two and a half bar units in such a way so as to preserve the flavour which Mr Gibbons imparts to his performances. Madelaine managed to do this without imposing any particular format on the dancer, as each performer should of course compose his or her own routine. It is going to be very difficult to repeat this class to cater for the both those who are new to this style and those who have attended this year's class, but I'm sure the organisers will manage it.

The Bert Bowden class concentrated on his hornpipe steps. Mr Bowden has a style all his own, one which I suspect several dancers found not to their taste. One really does need to be thoroughly familiar with the material being taught to assist at this type of class and here Melanie was occasionally in difficulties, although this was perhaps because Bert kept remembering new things during the course of the workshop! Although the organisers were clearly anxious to present Bert to the public as soon as possible, one felt that it was perhaps just a little too soon to expose the material in a workshop setting.

I gather that the workshops taken by Sam Sherry (waltz) and Pat Tracey (jig) were of the usual high standard. Because of the small attendance the afternoon displays were a little this on the ground, but this did not detract from their interest and meant that we had a extra 15mins for tea!

It will be interesting to see which way the organisers jump next year. Will they follow the Reading example of providing the same basic workshops each year, or the Newcastle policy of trying to make each year's offerings as new and different as possible. No date for next year's event has yet been announced so I'd keep February free next year in anticipation. I have.
