What about 'Set' instead of 'Pas de Basque' in the instructions of the Sword Dance? Or has 'set' some other technical use which would prevent it from being used here?
Secondly, I have changed my mind about 'air'. When 'position' is not abbreviated 'air' (without a stop) looks like a misprint of 'air'.

There is only one important comment on the chapter on Red Steps. On Pg you say

Herr Grants 'Springing through in time to the
music' may be Peacock's alternative. I

foot'.
