Your two letters arrived after I sent mine off. Thank you for the notes. I shall be writing a thank-you letter to George Nelson tonight and will raise the matters of Moffatt, Griberton, and the Buckie Reel celebrity.

Thanks also for the receipts; I have now worked out the expenses of the trip, and enclose them, together with the various receipts for your part of the bills. I had guessed that the *frichids* were frog orchids, but was far from sure. I think the "saxifrage" is *Draba argoides* ("yellow whitlow-grass" - probably wants leave outside the Crower peninsula line). The rosettes with fluffy heads are *Antennaria dioica* ("Mountain everlasting", widespread in hill districts). The rarer is the little white flower, ~~Scottish~~ *Arenaria norvegica* (Scottish Sandwort, very rare, only in Argyll, Rhin, W. Sutherland & Uist). I am afraid that ~~my~~ my two specimens of the last look some too healthy.

I have looked for my Buxton ~~papers~~ lecture, but don't seem to have them. Don't bother any further - one or other of us will come across them eventually.
