


CLOG & STEP DANCE FESTIVAL



Saturday 4th November 1989 AT Loddon Hall, Twyford NEAR Reading

11TH ANNUAL STEP AND CLOG DANCE FESTIVAL

This year sees some of the old favourites and also some new people. Pat Tracey will be teaching a hornpipe routine; Linda Heneghan is again offering a chance for us to try Irish step dancing, and Alex Boydell will cover freestyle and improvement of technique. Some of the Reading Cloggies will be passing on their expertise: Ian Dunmur will teach his usual set of 17 exhibition Lakeland steps, while John Walford goes back to the more basic Lakeland for beginners. Half-day classes will be taught by Sammy Bell, assisted by Laurie Mulliner: they will teach waltz steps in the morning and hornpipe in the afternoon. There will also be an opportunity to "Put the step back into country dancing in the afternoon, taught by Jennifer Millest. For those who fancy something from a little farther away, Dot Mulliner and Chris Brady will also divide up the day; Dot will teach Cape Breton steps in the morning, and Chris will put them into dances in the afternoon. Lynn and Joan, known to us as The Steptones will be teaching Appalachian.

There will be ample opportunity for you to spend your money. We hope that there will sales points for clogs, records, books and other paraphernalia. There will be a folk shop in attendance.

We also hope to have Pat Pickles with her exhibition and jig dolls and a selection of videos.

CLASSES - whole day

- PRT TYRCHY. Pat will teach a set of homepipe steps aimed at intermediate standard dancers.
- 2. Linda Heneghan. The Irish dance taught by Linda this year will be The Blackbird. Hard shoes rather them clogs should be worn, and Linda is aiming this at those of an intermediate standard.
- In Dunnur. In will teach his usual embinition set of 17 steps from Furness and South Lakeland, as listed in Instep % 13. This is a selection of stationary and moving steps, some simple and some more complex, almost all of which are from Flatt's Traditional Step Dancing in Lakeland. Although not technically very demanding, there is a lot to take in in one day if you are unfamiliar with the besic Lakeland steps.
- 4. John Walford. John will teach the ensurer steps from Flatt's Lakeland book. This class is sixed at those new to clog, or those who would like an easy introduction to the Lakeland hormpipe steps.
- 5. The Steptones. Appalachian clog, tampet by the experts:
 The class is likely to split into beginness and those with some
 experience, but the actual organization depends on those
 attending the class. All velcome, but place state whether
 beginners or intermediates on booking form.

ERRATUM

CLASSES -half day

- 6. Samey Bell with Laurie Mulliner.
- Morning: Hornpipe (intermediate). The sort of steps that won Sammy several championships in Northumberland in the 1930s.

 Afternoon: Waltz steps, which are fairly easy.
- 7. Dot Mulliner. Morning only. Dot will teach Cape Breton steps which were taught by Sandy Silva. There are real and strathspey steps for freestyle stepping. Fairly easy, and requires hard shoes rather than clogs.
- 8. Chris Brady. Afternoon only. Chris will put some of Dot's steps into routines. Not for those who don't know the steps!
- 9. Alex Boydell. Not for beginners; Alex will again cover freestyle and improvization in the morning. His afternoon session will be for you to improve your technique. Go along individually or in groups and let him help you with your footwork.
- 10. <u>Jennifer Millest</u>. Country dancing these days is all walked at worst, and has a bit of skipping or ranting in at best. Let Jennifer show you how to Put the Stepping Back into Traditional Dance. Shoes, not clogs, are required for this afternoon only session.

CTASS ALLOCATION Numbers for classes are determined by the room available. Wherever possible you will get your first choice. However, places will be allocated on a first come, first served basis. If one class is particularly in demand you may be disappointed. Please book early! If you find yourself in an unsuitable class, please contact the reception desk. They may be able to fit you in somewhere else, but limits on numbers mean that this cannot be guaranteed.

FOOTWEAR Dancing clogs are not essential - low heeled, hard soled shoes will do. Clogs are not required for classes taught by Jennifer Millest, Linda Heneghan or Dot Mulliner/Chris Brady. If you do wear clogs please do not wear irons since these damage the floors.

CHILDREN AND ANIMALS Animals do not do terribly well in classes such as these. Please leave them behind. Small children tend to get bored and disruptive. If you want to bring a child too young to dance, let us know. It may be possible to organise a creche.

FILMING AND RECORDING Please ask permission of performers beforehand. If special lighting etc is required please organise this with us in advance.

SALES There will be various trade stalls available. f you have clogs or anything else to sell, bring it along.
