

Dance Instruction (4 concurrent sessions)

Sammy Bell born in Ashington, Northumberland learnt to dance from Jimmy Ellwood, Eddie May, and George Golightly. Thrice champion, he gave up dancing in 1935 aged 21. He moved south in '38 + thought no more about clog dancing until Johnson Ellwood contacted him in 1976 when reviving the Northern Counties Contest. He is now a highly valued member of the Reading Clog Group + will teach a sequence of 6 waltz steps suitable for intermediate dancers

Mike Cherny will take a practical approach to clog dancing for beginners. The basic steps + movements of clog will be taught in a sequence of steps related to Lancashire + NE style dished hornpipe steps. The class will continue throughout the day with plenty of time for revision, notation + individual consultation.

Ian Dunmur will teach a series of 8 Lakeland steps suitable for the annual competition or for exhibition. Some of the more complicated sequences given in the Fletts' book will be included. Thus the sessions will be best suited to people with some experience of this style.

Jennifer Millett The morning sessions will trace the development from the basic single step + double step to stepping used in social dances as well as in solo stepping, in increasing complexity. Some of these steps will be set in the context of reels and country dances in the first afternoon session, and others will be put together as a set of Westmorland steps in the second afternoon session. Recommended for those interested in a wider approach to step dancing.

Musicians. Whilst not planning a full day's programme for musicians, there will be several items of interest during the day. Ian Dunmur will lead an informal lunch time session in which all, with instruments, are invited to take part. A number of archival films of particular interest to musicians are available for showing. Dance group musicians who would like the opportunity of playing for a class are invited to make themselves known to Ian Dunmur. Peter Clifton's talk will include field recordings of Norfolk musicians.

Peter Clifton will give an illustrated talk on his work with Ann-Maree Hulme on step dancing + music in NW Norfolk

Exhibitions + Demonstrations:


Neil Standring will demonstrate traditional clog making. There will be a table of interesting exhibits. He will also show how to make a pair of clogs using household tools
