Country Dances. All the Morris Sword and Country dancers at this Festival are amateurs, the country dancers being drawn from groups and clubs of the Society practising for pleasure in different parts of England.

The children from Gloucestershire and Colchester provide examples of folk dancing directly encouraged by most Education Authorities either as out of school recreation or as part of the school curriculum.

The Ballet. On 1st March, 1960, the Royal Ballet Schools opened the Gala Performance at Covent Garden with a programme of English Folk Dances. At this Festival, the Senior Students are repeating part of their programme, dancing in the costumes which were designed and made specially for the Gala Performance.

The students training to become professional dancers, receive instruction in folk dancing as part of their general training in rhythmic freedom and musical sensibility.



## The "Visitors"

Germany. In the German Federal Republic there is no uniform folk dance organization, but probably many youth clubs and country societies include folk dancing among their other activities. The Stuttgart Folk Dance and Song Group are such a group, from the South-West of Germany. Their interest covers folk dance, song and costume. They have already visited many foreign lands, including Sweden, Denmark, Holland, Belgium, France, South Tyrol, Austria, South America and South Africa.

The sword dance which they perform is reconstructed from a number of expired traditions. It corresponds most closely with the description of the dance from Ulm on the Danube. The Ribbon Dance or Maypole Dance is associated both with May Day festivals and Harvest Thanksgivings. The group sing German madrigals as well as folk songs.

They have already established friendly links with the Society, when teams from both countries met on the tours of South Africa in 1955 and 1960. They were then led, as they are today, by Kurt Wager and his wife.
