
FOUR NATIONALITIES WILL DANCE

Three hundred picked dancers from England, Scotland, Ireland, and Denmark will give displays at the New Year festival of the English Folk-Dance and Song Society in London on Friday and Saturday. Ages of the dancers will range from 17 to 77.

Fifty couples will perform "Princess Margaret's Fancy," the dance composed in honour of the Society's patron. Forty branches of the Society will be represented.

Competitors will include a team of six Yorkshire iron-stone miners, villagers from Northumberland, and a Durham boy, Jackie Toaduff, who will perform a solo clog dance. Fourteen dancers from Jutland will make up the Danish team.

The festival will open with a traditional American carol recently discovered in Virginia, which is thought to be of British origin.
