

Folk-dancing

PRINCESS MARGARET is returning to London from Sandringham next week to attend the annual festival of the English Folk Dance and Song Society at the Albert Hall. She is patron of the society and has taken part in folk-dancing at the society's headquarters in St. Pancras.

Except during the war, this festival has been held every year since 1926. More than 500 dancers from all over the country, as well as teams from abroad, will take part this year.

Jackie Toaduff, a 21-year-old miner from County Durham who is a champion clog-dancer, will give an exhibition; there will be massed displays by a trained corps of nearly 200 dancers, and demonstrations by English Morris and sword teams.
